Transposing EU Procurement Directives

The 2014 EU Procurement Directives have been adopted by the EU institutions. The Cabinet Office is preparing ambitious plans for early transposition, so that the UK can take advantage of the additional flexibilities offered in particular by the provisions of Directive 2014/24/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 26 February 2014 on public procurement and repealing Directive 2004/18/EC.

Minister for the Cabinet Office Francis Maude said: „EU rules used to make it hard for government to exclude suppliers with a poor performance record and so it’s good news that the changes will make it easier for us to manage contracts effectively.”

The Directives were published in the Official Journal of the EU on 28 March 2014 and came into force on 17 April 2014. The term 'Journal' is misleading, as production of the hard copy version ceased in 1997, and can now be accessed online. In the S series of the Journal, around 2500 new notices, including prior information notices, contract notices and contract award notices, are advertised every week.
